General Information

Final marks for each course must be submitted through the Lakehead University **Marks Management** system. This is the official means of collecting final grades and is a more accurate reflection of student registration as the **Marks Management** roster information is built from a student's academic record.

Marks Management is the preferred system for all mark reporting (assignments, tests, mid-terms, papers, etc.) as the interim marks can be either shared with students or not, the information is kept on file, the information entered can be restored if there are network issues, and **Marks Management** is accessible from any computer as long as internet service is available. This system also ensures more security in terms of marks submission and guarantees that all student records and grades remain confidential as they are accessed by the instructor attached to the course and only by logging in through the secure myPortal.

Final marks must be submitted no later than the date published in the current academic calendar and normally should be within 4 business days after the last day of class, or after the final examination has taken place. Earlier final mark submission is strongly encouraged where possible as it will help to ensure timely feedback to students and will aid in the evaluation of prerequisite checks, academic standing, graduation and academic and financial awards.

Marks must be submitted electronically. Once marks have been submitted electronically through **Marks Management**, an electronic copy will be sent to your department Chair/Director/Faculty Dean for approval. Once the Chair/Director/Faculty Dean has verified and electronically approved the marks, these will then be automatically (overnight) uploaded to the student transcript. Once verified to the student transcript, students will then be able to view their official final marks on myPortal.

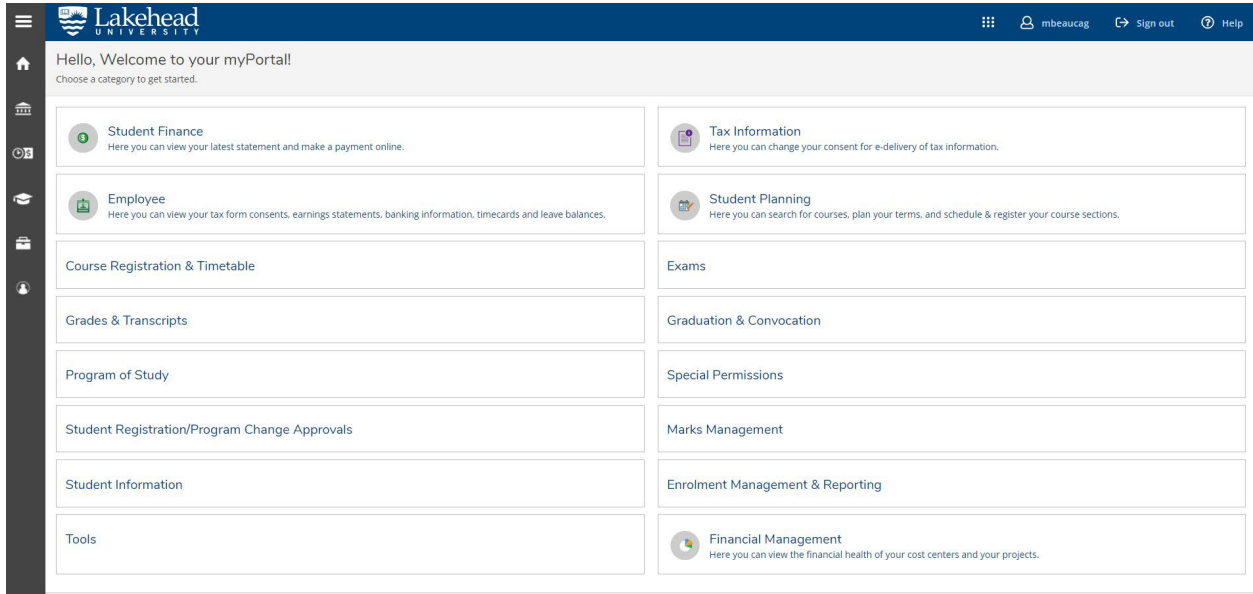

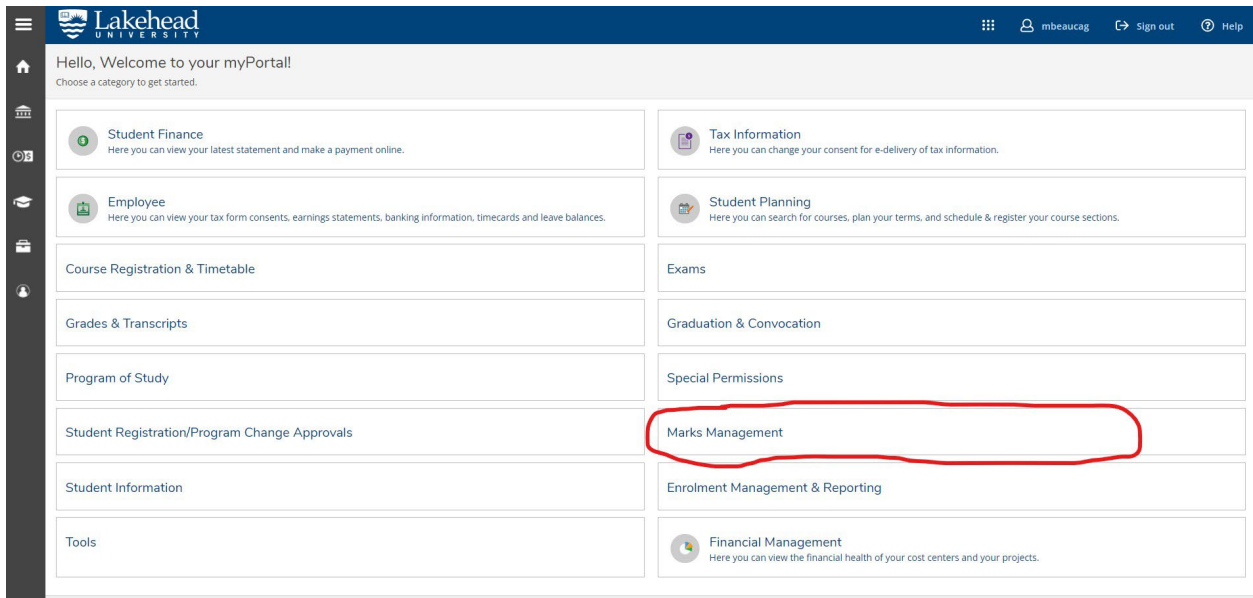

How to Find Marks Management in the New System

Start by signing into the myPortal system. Once logged in, you'll find yourself on the "HOME" screen of the new system, which looks like this:



As shown below, you can find a quick link to "MARKS MANAGEMENT" as a main category box on the "HOME" screen:

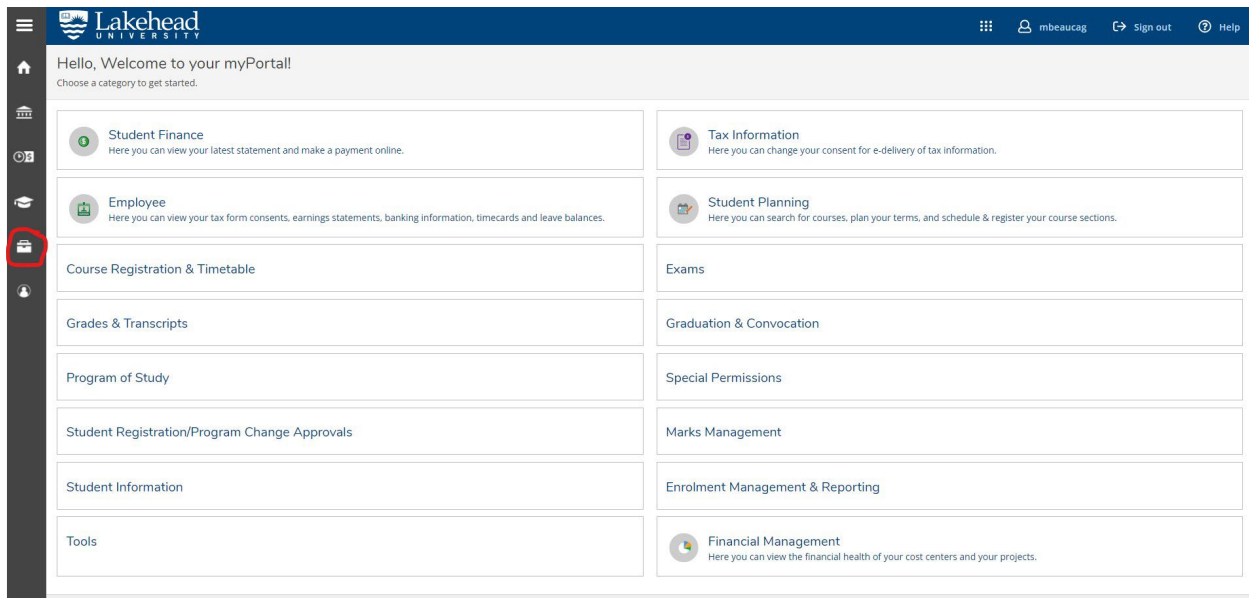


You can click the "MARKS MANAGEMENT" category box and be directed to the "COURSE SECTION SEARCH FORM" that will be familiar from the previous iteration of myInfo.

From here, you can follow the steps outlined through the remainder of this document – the “MARKS MANAGEMENT” processes have not changed – how we access the “MARKS MANAGEMENT” system has changed.

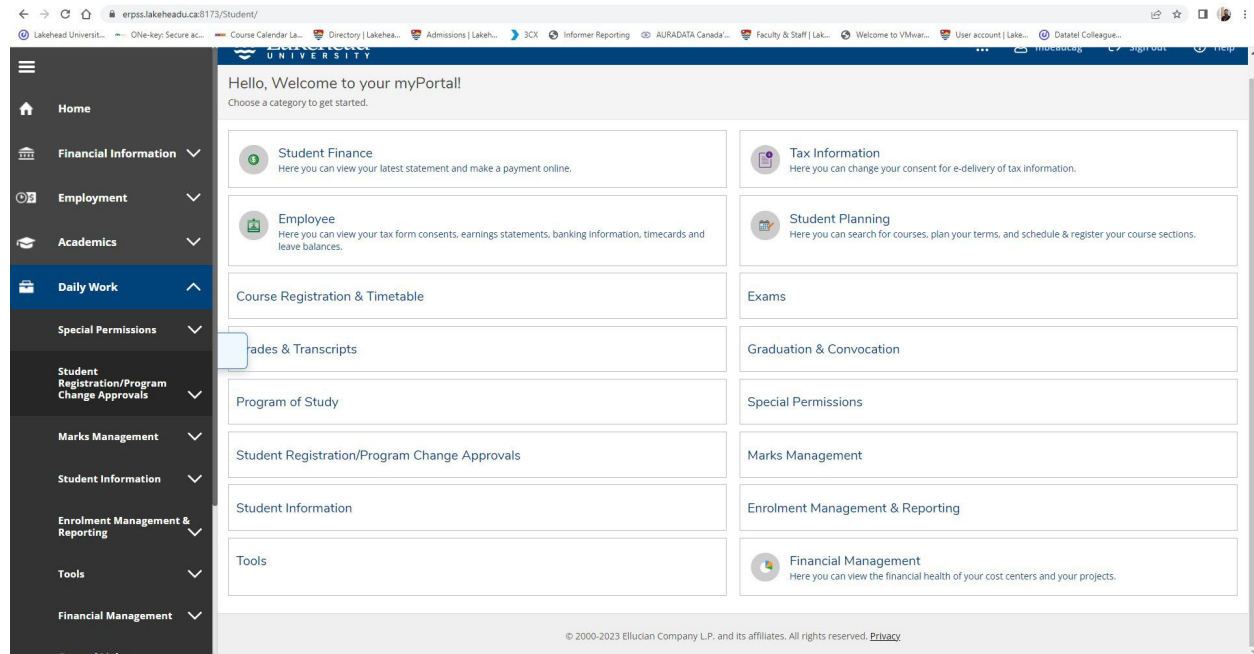
NOTE: There is another way to access “MARKS MANAGEMENT” from the new “HOME” screen.

As shown below, you can click the “DAILY WORK” icon located to the left of the “HOME” screen:

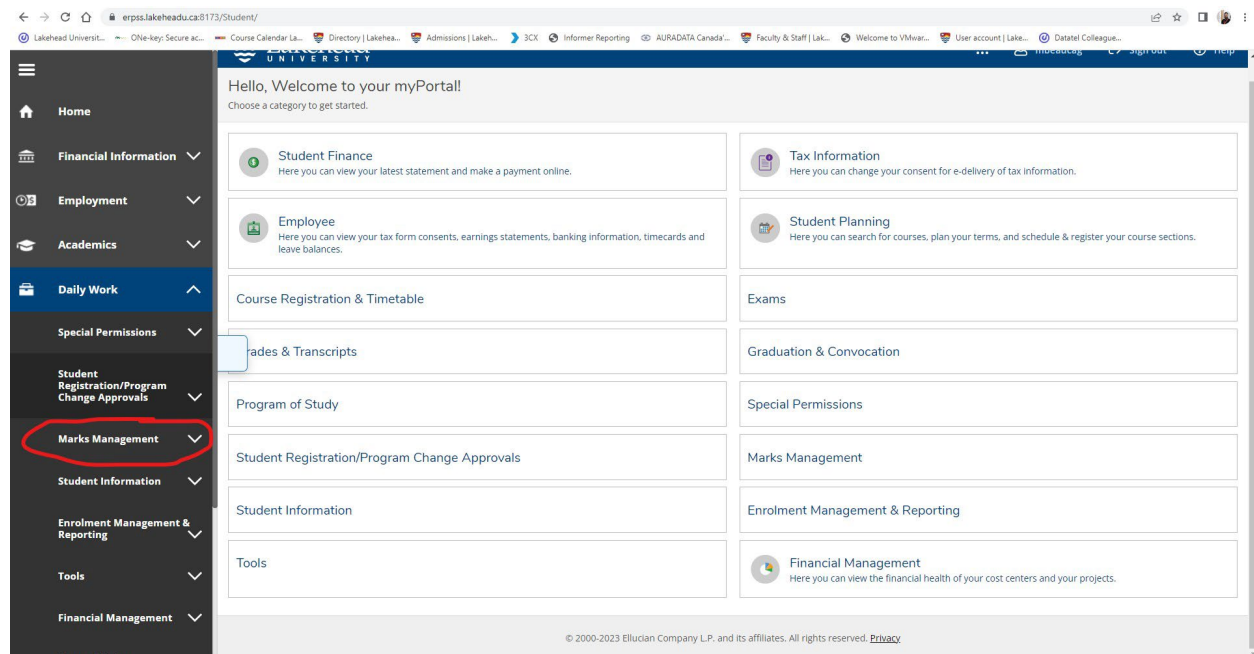


NOTE: “DAILY WORK” essentially provides the same functional purpose as the “EMPLOYEE” tab would have in the previous iteration of myInfo.

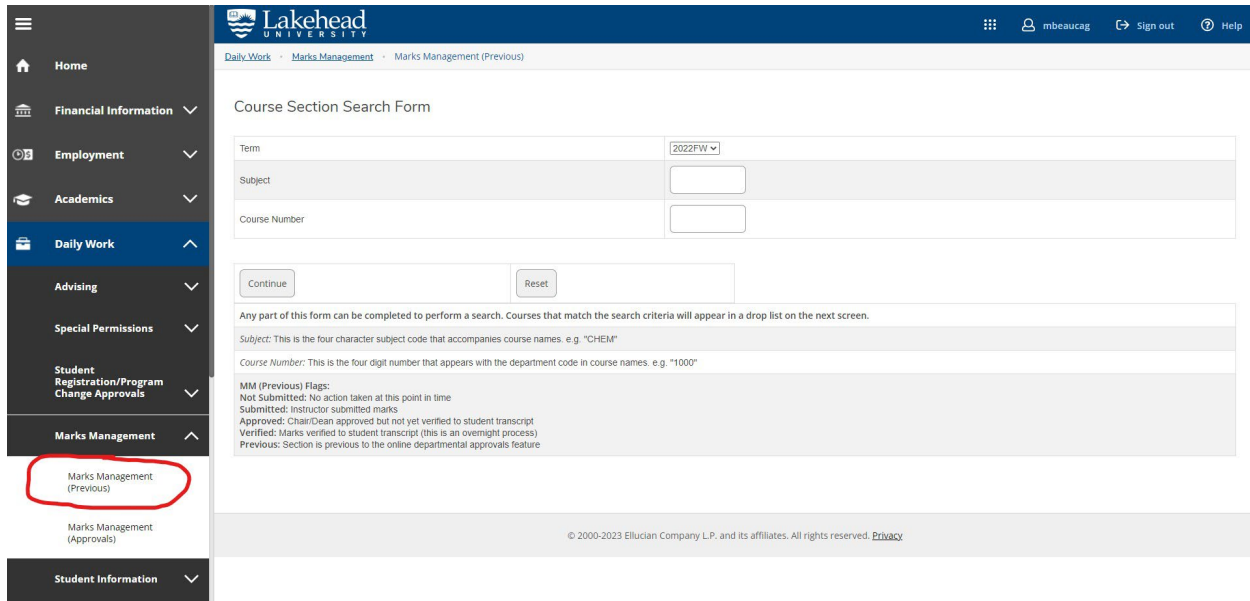
Clicking the “DAILY WORK” icon will expand the “DAILY WORK” functional menu, providing you with an alternative route to access the “MARKS MANAGEMENT” system:



As shown below, once the “DAILY WORK” icon is expanded, you can click on the “MARKS MANAGEMENT” subheading for an alternative route of accessing the “MARKS MANAGEMENT” system:



Once you click on the “MARKS MANAGEMENT” subheading, the final step to accessing the “MARKS MANAGEMENT” system is clicking on “MARKS MANAGEMENT (PREVIOUS)” as shown below:



As mentioned above, from here, you can follow the steps outlined through the remainder of this document – the “MARKS MANAGEMENT” processes have not changed – how we access the “MARKS MANAGEMENT” system has changed.

Course Section Search Form

Marks Management can be located in myPortal using the instructions provided above. Once you've clicked on the **"MARKS MANAGEMENT"** category box and/or subheading, you'll be directed to the **"COURSE SECTION SEARCH FORM"**.

NOTE: For those that have entered marks previously, the process remains the same as previous academic terms.

Verify that the term is correct (changing via the drop-down if necessary), enter in the course **"SUBJECT"** and **"COURSE NUMBER"** of what you are looking for, and then click **"CONTINUE"**:

Edit Grade Scheme

The “**EDIT GRADE SCHEME**” function allows you to create and set a grade scheme for your course IF IT IS A NUMERIC GRADED COURSE. This function allows you to assign the breakdown of marks and percentages you are allotting to your course.

NOTE: If the course is a PASS/FAIL section, a grading scheme may **NOT** be set up.

Default Grade Scheme:

The default grade scheme for ALL courses is **One Mark** with a Highest Possible Score of 100, a Weight on Final Mark of 100, and a Deliver to Students value of “N”. This means that without setting up your own unique grade scheme, you can still enter and submit a final mark.

If you would like to set up your own grading scheme, it is recommended that you do this **BEFORE YOUR COURSE STARTS**. Setting up a section grading scheme may only be done where the grade being submitted is a **NUMERIC** grade. If assistance is need, please contact Enrolment Services.

Columns:

Columns are what you are grading your students on (i.e.: assignment, presentation, exam, essay, etc.). You may add as many columns as you want and they can be titled whatever is convenient for you. Columns are added only one at a time, but the screen will always have the option to add new columns if you so desire.

Highest Possible Score:

This will be the value you decide the assignment, essay, project, etc. is marked on. This value is used to calculate the percent of marks achieved on this item to count towards the final grade.

Weight on Final Mark:

This is the numeric value (out of 100) you are allotting the column. The weight is divided by the total weights to obtain a percent out of 100 for a final mark.

NOTE: the combined total **MUST** add up to 100 regardless of the number of columns you decide upon. It cannot be over or under that amount as it will block you from submitting final marks.

Deliver to Students:

This function allows you control over which interim marks your students can see and which they cannot.

NOTE: Some instructors use this function to hold marks from view as a particular assignment is being graded so as to be fair in rolling out interim marks to their entire class. They leave the flag as an “N” while working on grading, and then change the “N” flag to a “Y” when all student marks have been entered so that all students can see their own marks at the same time.

NOTE: when the “DELIVER TO STUDENTS” flag is “Y”, the student can see their interim mark ONLY until the final mark has been submitted electronically. Once the final grade has been submitted, the interim marks are no longer viewable through myPortal.

Enter Marks

The “ENTER MARKS” screen allows you to enter the grades for each assignment, test, exam that you have set up in your grade scheme.

When entering marks use the following guidelines:

Incomplete: INCOMPLETES SHOULD ONLY BE ASSIGNED TO A FINAL GRADE ONLY AND SHOULD INCORPORATE THE NUMERIC GRADE THE STUDENT HAS RECEIVED TO-DATE. For example: 62i. In the case of a course with PASS/FAIL (i.e. practicums, placements), you should enter INC as the final grade. Please reference the [Incomplete Standing Regulations](#) before using this feature.

An incomplete grade may, at the discretion of the instructor and **in consultation with the student**, be assigned to a course when the instructor considers that for a **valid reason** the student has not yet completed all the requirements of the course. In such cases, when a percentage grade would normally be assigned to the course, the instructor must also assign a grade for work completed to that point, expressed as a portion of the entire course mark.

Courses graded on a Pass/Fail basis will be assigned an **INC**. Incomplete grades will not be included in the calculation of the student's average.

Zero (0): A zero (0) as a **final grade** is reserved for **Academic Misconduct**. Interim assignments, tests, exams, papers, etc., may be assigned grades of zero within **Marks Management** if the final grade does not result in zero (0) unless in the case of Academic Misconduct.

FNW or 01: Failure **No Withdrawal** or 01 may be assigned in cases where a student is currently listed as active on the class roster but has not attended class nor completed any course work.

FNW counts as a failure but does not contribute towards average calculations.

Inactive: If the status of the student is inactive, this means the student has withdrawn from the course. No mark should be assigned to inactive students. To turn off the display of inactive students, simply select “Do not show inactive students” from the main **Marks Management** page and click Continue to save your selection.

NOTE: ONCE YOU HAVE FINISHED ENTERING MARKS YOU WILL NEED TO SAVE. The marks are now stored for future use and can be viewed at any time. Please note that if you leave the page prior to clicking “**SAVE**”, your marks may not be recorded accurately.

There is an **AutoSaved** feature which will automatically save **Marks Management** information while you are working on entering marks. The **AutoSaved** runs every 60 seconds when you are entering marks and date stamps for reference purposes.

It would look similar to:

“AutoSaved on: Thu Dec 03 2015 15:19:59 GMT-0500 (Eastern Standard Time)”

NOTE: A mark must be entered for every student with an active status. A valid mark is one of the following:

Grade Scheme	Grade	Applicability
Numeric	1-100	Whole numbers only.
Non-Numeric	P or F	Only used for courses offering the Pass/Fail designation.
Incomplete	XXi or INC	Where XX is a numeric value. Should be assigned to final grades only.

You may not enter **W** or **Withdrawal** as a final grade. **W** is reserved for **Late Withdrawals** and the student must initiate the process by submitting a **Petition for Late Withdrawal** to the University Registrar.

NOTE: If a student remains active on your class roster, but they have indicated that they have submitted a **Withdrawal Request** for the course, you still need to provide the student with a final grade, which will revert to a **W** when/if the **Withdrawal Request** is approved and processed.

YOU MAY NOT ENTER A FINAL GRADE OF 0 (ZERO = ACADEMIC DISHONESTY).

Grades of 0 (Zero = Academic Dishonesty) involve an academic investigation, as such, they cannot be submitted electronically.

Restore Marks from a Previous State

The “RESTORE MARKS FROM A PREVIOUS STATE” allows you to reset your marks to a pre-stamped AutoSaved date and time. Once on the restore marks from a previous state screen, just click the drop-down and select the date and time you would like your marks reset to.

NOTE: If you have submitted your final marks to Enrolment Services, you will NOT be able to restore marks from a previous state but will need to contact:

- Chair/Director (if marks have not yet been approved)
- Enrolment Services (if marks have been approved)

Resetting submitted marks will only be possible in the instances where final marks have been submitted but have NOT been verified by Enrolment Services to the student’s transcript.

In these cases, please connect with Enrolment Services, as alternate arrangements will need to be made to change marks for an entire class roster.

View Marks

The “**VIEW MARKS**” function allows you to clearly see the marks you have already entered. If you entered a grade scheme, the View Marks function will allow you to view each individual mark as well as each student final mark based on the work to-date.

The View Marks page also provides statistical information at the bottom of the page including: Student Count, Class Average (Ave), Maximum (Max), Minimum (Min), Median and Standard Deviation (StDev).

The Student Count is a quick way to make sure you have entered all marks.

NOTE: a mark of zero **DOES NOT** contribute towards the count and, if you have entered a mark erroneously on an inactive student record, this will add to the count.

To leave the View Marks page, just select “**DONE**” at the bottom of the page. This will bring you back to the main **Marks Management** page.

Enter Final Marks Overrides

The “ENTER FINAL MARKS OVERRIDES” screen allows you to make changes to marks prior to submitting the final grades for approval.

This may be needed in cases where something unusual has happened to affect numerous student grades.

This screen can also be used to enter incomplete final grades. An incomplete may be given in lieu of a grade for unfinished coursework based on unforeseeable circumstances. See [University Regulation V \(e\) of the Current Academic Calendar](#) for further information.

When entering marks through the “FINAL MARKS OVERRIDES” screen, if you are entering an incomplete grade, you will also need to select “INCOMPLETE” from the drop down menu in the “MODIFIER” column.

NOTE: If you enter an incomplete mark and the student completes the work prior to you submitting final marks to the Chair/Director/Dean, you will need to remove the incomplete and save out before being able to change the final grade to a non-incomplete mark.

Do Not Show Inactive Students/Show Inactive Students

This feature allows you to change your **Marks Management** class lists to either include or exclude inactive students. The wording is either:

- Do not show inactive students
- Show inactive students

NOTE: the main **Marks Management** pages will show wording of what **WILL** happen if you select the button, **NOT** what is happening currently.

For example, if **“DO NOT SHOW INACTIVE STUDENTS”** is currently displayed on your main page, this means that, if you detail into any class list screen, **it WILL show inactive students** until you select that button and click **“CONTINUE”**.

The above screen means only active students will currently display until you select **“SHOW INACTIVE STUDENTS”** and click **“CONTINUE”**.

Submit Final Marks to the Chair/Director/Dean

Final grades need to be submitted electronically. Marks will be submitted electronically to the Chair/Director if you are an instructor and to the Dean if you are an instructor and the Chair/Director.

Once all marks have been recorded into the **Marks Management** system, and you are ready to submit the final grades, select **“SUBMIT FINAL MARKS TO THE CHAIR/DEAN”** from the main Marks Management page and then click **“CONTINUE”**.

The next page will show a list of all your students along with their grades. You will want to make sure you review and verify the marks are what you intend to submit to your Chair/Director/Dean for verification. If needed, you can enter comments about your marks. You will then click **“SEND TO CHAIR,”** which will send your marks electronically to your department approver.

Once you have submitted marks for approval, you will have "View Marks" access only.

For individual student marks corrections please use the "Change of Mark" form.

For whole-class mark corrections:

- Contact your Chair if marks have not been approved
- Contact Enrolment Services if marks have been approved.

NOTE: you will receive email confirmation when marks have been approved.

If you have NOT been successful in submitting your marks, this will also be indicated. If you do not know what the problem or issue is, or you do not know how to resolve it, please contact Enrolment Services for assistance.

NOTE: submitting your grades electronically sends them to your Chair/Director/Dean for approval PRIOR to showing on the student transcript. Once the marks have been reviewed by the Chair/Director and electronically approved, the marks are then forwarded to Enrolment Services where they are held overnight to be automatically uploaded to the student transcript.

Only when a mark has been posted to the student’s transcript is it considered an official final mark.

Once a mark is posted to the student transcript, students will no longer be able to view their interim marks through myPortal – my marks, but they will be able to view their final grade through myPortal – my transcript.

NOTE: If you have any questions about this process, you may wish to connect with your departmental administrative support team for further instructions.

How to Remove an Incomplete Grade

1. Select “ENTER FINAL MARK OVERRIDES”. Continue.
2. Go to the incomplete mark you want to remove and delete it. Leave the “OVERRIDE VALUE” column blank and change the corresponding “MODIFIER” to “NONE” using the drop-down function. Click save.
3. Select “ENTER MARKS”. Continue.
4. Go to the mark you originally wanted to change and delete it so the field is blank. Save.
5. Select “ENTER MARKS”. Continue.
6. The field should now be blank and you can add your new mark and continue as you normally would.

*****NOTE: Incomplete grades should ONLY be assigned to a FINAL grade*****

Assigning an incomplete grade to a paper, assignment, project, test or exam is **NOT RECOMMENDED** as it creates problems for you later on.

If you do enter an incomplete grade for anything other than a FINAL grade, you will need to complete the above steps to remove it.

Details You Should Know

1. Once you have submitted final marks electronically, you will no longer have access to changing marks online through Marks Management, but you will still have access to viewing the marks entered.
2. If you have submitted final marks in error, you must immediately contact:
 - a. Chair/Director (if marks have not yet been approved)
 - b. Enrolment Services (if marks have been approved)

NOTE: Waiting may result in students seeing incorrect marks and/or may also result in you having to submit individual Change of Mark Forms for each person in the class.
